## TITLE VII INDIAN EDUCATION PROGRAM

### ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible for this program, students must meet the following criteria (1) be a member (as defined by the Indian tribe or band) of an Indian tribe or band, including those Indian tribe or bands terminated since 1940, and those recognized by the State in which the tribe or band reside; or (2) a descendant in the first or second degree (parent or grandparent) as described in (1), or (3) considered by the Secretary of the Interior to be an Indian for any purpose, or (4) an Eskimo or Aleut, or other Alaska Native, **or** (5) a member of an organized Indian group that received a grant under the Indian Education Act of 1988 as it is in effect Oct. 19, 1994.

### SERVICES:

1. Native American student counseling services, offered by John Ann Thompson
2. Career and Cultural Activities through High School Heritage Club, Native American Culture and Language Classes in the middle school, Native American month in the elementary school, middle school art classes, Native American Art, tribal studies and Cherokee Language classes in the high school.
3. Materials and supplies for culture/art/language classes
4. Library and research materials about Native American History/Culture
5. High School Heroes Peer Teaching program
6. Tutoring - K-8, contact Lisa Thorpe at the lower elementary and Joan Spade at the middle school for more details
7. Math tutoring 4-12 grades before or after school.
8. Guest Speakers
9. Supplemental tutorial programs, and computer software for remediation activities.
10. AP class testing fee reimbursement
11. Field trips and state/national conventions
12. College and Career information, scholarship and grant information and assistance.
