School Mission/Vision

Title 1

Grove Upper Elementary Schools is a school-wide Title I school. The purpose of the Title I, Part A program is to ensure that all children have the opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards and assessments. These funds are available to schools meeting the required percentage threshold for the free/ reduced lunch program.

Title I- Part A funds are used to improve education for **all** students. The strategy behind this program is to raise the academic levels of low-achieving students by improving instruction and learning throughout the entire school. In general, school wide programs:

- plan for comprehensive, long-term improvement
- serve all students with highly qualified teachers and paraprofessionals
- provide for continuous learning for staff, parents and community
- Use evidence-based practices to develop and implement enriched instruction for all students
